

Name:	Table game for learning social skills
Goal:	To learn and practice the basic social skills they need to become active citizens
Methods used:	combinations of instructions, modeling, playing game, informational feedback, and social reinforcement
Material:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A commercially available table game (Ludo) - Game cards simply specify the number of spaces a player may move, each revised card included this number and a social situation designed to elicit a complex verbal response from the player before his or her game piece could be moved. - A 24-card deck was used because it permitted an equal number of responses from the six skill areas to be trained during each game (i.e. four cards per area) and four players each game (i.e. three subjects and the facilitator).
Procedure:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Randomize the cards by shuffling them prior to the baseline, 2. The facilitator read each player's card at the beginning of each turn. 3. After any response by the player, the facilitator merely requested that the player move the number of spaces designated on the card. The facilitator always gave (modeled) a correct response on his/her turn. 4. Players were allowed 10 sec. in which to initiate a response to the card situation. This rule was used to limit the possibility of other players responding to a card and to encourage spontaneous responding. 5. The number of spaces moved each turn is determined by drawing a numbered card from a deck. 6. No extra turns were allowed 7. Players were allowed to move out of "start" or into "home" regardless of whether they selected a card with the exact number 8. The game ended when all cards in the deck were used instead of when one player had moved all of his or her game pieces home. The player with the most pieces home or closest to home was declared the winner.
Conditions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The trainer provided specific verbal feedback; (If a correct response was given, the trainer simply stated "good answer." If a response was incorrect the trainer said "that's wrong," repeated the situation, and gave a correct response.) - Players were only allowed to move their game pieces when they responded correctly.
